Day 7: David

## David's story:

David was the youngest of seven sons and a descendant of Ruth and Boaz. He used to tend to the sheep of his father, Yishai. At this time, Shaul had been anointed by the *navi* (prophet) Shmuel as the first king of Israel, but after Shaul sinned, Shmuel came to anoint David. Before officially taking over as king, David came to Shaul's palace as a skilled harpist who would help calm Shaul when he was troubled. Shaul's army was battling the Philistines at the time, and they needed a strong warrior to take on the Philistine giant, Goliath. Even though David was far smaller than Goliath, he managed to defeat the giant, which helped David grow in popularity, making Shaul jealous. This jealousy led Shaul to attempt to kill David a number of times. David developed a deep friendship with Shaul's son, Yonatan, with Yonatan even helping protect David from his father.
